#### **CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT JEFFREY L. STROUT**

Chief Master Sergeant Jeffrey L. Strout is the Air Force Public Health Career Field Manager and the Public Health Manager, Public Health Flight, 89th Aerospace Medicine Squadron, Andrews AFB, Maryland.

Chief Strout was born in Wausau, Wisconsin in 1960. He attended Zephyrhills High School in Florida. He was active in the Future Farmers of America and was the editor of a national award-winning and profitable yearbook. He was named in **Who's Who Among American High School Students** for his junior and senior years.

Chief Strout joined the Air Force in December 1978 as a Veterinary Specialist and was assigned to Eglin AFB, Florida. He was promoted to staff sergeant in December 1981 with less than three years service. While at Eglin, he provided food inspection services for two operational exercises, **BOLD EAGLE** 1979 and 1981, inspecting approximately 92 tons of food per day, for seven weeks. In January 1982, he was assigned to Hanscom AFB, Massachusetts, where he took the reins as NCOIC, Veterinary Services and orchestrated the transition from Veterinary to Environmental Health Services with very little guidance. He was handpicked to be an instructor at the School of Aerospace Medicine (USAFSAM) in 1984.

Assigned to the Environmental Health Branch, USAFSAM, he was appointed Career Development Course (CDC) Writer for the 908X0 career field. He was selected as the Education Division NCO of the Year in 1986 and was promoted to Master Sergeant in May 1991. He was reassigned as Superintendent, Military Public Health, Andersen AFB, Guam, in April 1991. He was the driving force and manager of the animal quarantine facility during the contingency of repatriating American personnel from the Philippines during OPERATION FIERY VIGIL. In May 1992, he was selected as the Superintendent, Aerospace Medicine. He was reassigned as the Superintendent, Aeromedical Services, at the 17th Medical Group, Goodfellow AFB, Texas, in May 1993. Eighteen months later he was reassigned to the 81st Aerospace Medicine Squadron at Keesler AFB, Mississippi and promoted to Senior Master Sergeant where he was the Superintendent, Public Health and First Sergeant for the squadron. He then was reassigned to HQ AMC where he served as the MAJCOM Public Health and Health Promotion Manager at Scott AFB, Illinois from 1998-2001. For 5 of the past 10 years, he has been a MAJCOM nominee for the Colonel Cleveland L. Parker Award as the best Public Health enlisted member. He received a Bachelors Degree from William Carey College and earned the Distinguished Graduate Award at the Air Force Systems Command Leadership School in 1983, the ATC NCO Academy in 1987 and the SNCO Academy in 1995.

Chief Strout's awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal (4 OLC), Air Force Commendation Medal (2 OLC), Air Force Achievement Medal (3 OLC), Humanitarian Service Medal (1 device).
